CORRECTIONS

Longitudinal Assessment of Neurocognitive Function after Coronary-Artery Bypass Surgery (February 8, 2001;344:395-402). On page 397, in Table 1, the age of the patients who completed follow-up should have been 60.6 ± 10.4 , not 61.0 ± 10.4 , as printed. For patients who did not complete follow-up, the duration of cardiopulmonary bypass (in minutes) should have been 108.5 ± 35.3 , not 112.8 ± 42.1 , and the percentage with previous myocardial infarction should have been 57.1, not 47.1.

Atrial Fibrillation (April 5, 2001;344:1067-78). On page 1071, in Table 2, the maintenance dose for propafenone should have been, "150-300 mg every 8 hours," not "150-300 mg twice daily," as printed.
