

on this subject. There is a discussion of reduced parental life expectancy, the probability of illness, and the responsibility of the physician in assisting with fertility treatment. The American Society for Reproductive Medicine document on HIV is not mentioned.

The overall tone of this book is perhaps best summarized in the final chapter, which describes the various disagreements in different parts of the world about what is "ethical" as "cultural diversity, but common goals." Most American physicians and practitioners will find this book long on arguments and short on practical applications. It is best intended for students of ethics, particularly those interested in assisted reproduction, who will most appreciate the thorough discussion and the references.
