A Randomized Trial of Exemestane after Two to Three Years of Tamoxifen Therapy in Postmenopausal Women with Primary Breast Cancer (March 11, 2004;350:1081-92). On page 1083, in Figure 1, the number of patients who were assigned to receive two to three years of tamoxifen therapy should have read 2380, rather than 2362, as printed, and the number of patients assigned to receive exemestane therapy should have read 2362, rather than 2380, as printed.
